Data Used for China NTA

- Chinese Household Income Project (CHIP)
 - conducted by the China Social Science Academy through the National Bureau of Statistics.
 - conducted every 7 years. So far, three waves of surveys have been conducted at 1988, 1995, 2002 and 2007 respectively.
 - We used CHIP 1995 and 2002 to conduct NTA

Time Use Data in China

- China Time Use Survey (CTUS)
 - conducted by National Bureau of Statistics
 - only for 2008
 - standard time use survey
 - national representative sample
- Chinese Family Panel Studies (CFPS)
 - conducted by Peking University
 - 2008,2009,2010
 - include time use information
 - pilot: 2008, 2009; national representative: 2010

Chinese Family Panel Studies (CFPS)

- CFPS is designed by experts from all social sciences departments, schools, and institutes in Peking University
- CFPS collects data of individuals, family, and community and has 4 questionnaires: Community, Family, Adolescent and Adult.
- CFPS2008, 2009:
 - Beijing, Shanghai, and Guangdong Province;
 - 24 district/country, 96 communities, 2,400 households
 - 7214 individuals in 2008; 5489 individuals in 2009
- CFPS2010:
 - Cover 25 provinces of total 34;
 - 7188 households; 16396 adults + 4424 children

- By week day and weekend
- Time use

China Time Use Survey (CTUS)


- CTUS is counted by China National Bureau of Statistics
- CTUS collects data of 24-hour time use individually:
 - SNA productive activities; Non-SNA productive activities; Non- productive activities(personal activities)
 - by workday and weekend
 - by average t, participation rate, average t of participants
- CTUS 2008
 - cover age 15-74
 - cover 10 provinces: Beijing, Hebei, Heilongjiang, Zhejiang, Anhui, Henan, Guangdong, Sichuan, Yunnan, Gansu;
 - 202 district/county
 - 16,661 households; 37,142 individuals: urban-19,621 rural-17,521; male -18,215, femal-18927


Non-SNA productive activities

- Unpaid housework
 - cooking
 - house cleaning
 - laundry
 - shopping
 - take care of pets
 - repair and maintenance
 - housework planning and administration
- Take care of families and support other people
 - 1. take care of immature family members
 - take care of adult family members
 - help for to non-family members
 - 4. community service and non-profit activities








